# Specified Substances

---

## 4.2.2 Specified Substances.

~~All~~ For purposes of the application of Article 10 (Sanctions on Individuals), all Prohibited Substances shall be "Specified Substances", except substances in the classes of anabolic agents and hormones and those stimulants and hormone antagonists and modulators so identified on the *Prohibited List*, ~~shall be "Specified Substances" for purposes of the application of Article 10 (Sanctions on Individuals).~~ *Prohibited Methods* shall not be Specified Substances.

# Status during Ineligibility

---

*[Comment to Article 10.10.1: For example, an ineligible Athlete cannot participate in a training camp, exhibition or practice organized by his or her National Federation or a club which is a member of that National Federation. Further, an ineligible Athlete may not compete in a non-Signatory professional league (e.g., the National Hockey League, ~~Union of European Leagues of the National~~ [Basketball Association](#), etc.), Events organized by a non-Signatory International Event organization or a non-Signatory national-level event organization without triggering the consequences set forth in Article 10.10.2. Sanctions in one sport will also be recognized by other sports (see Article 15.4 Mutual Recognition).]*

# Appeals

---

## 13.2.3 Persons Entitled to Appeal.

In cases under Article 13.2.1, the following parties shall have the right to appeal to CAS: (a) the *Athlete* or other *Person* who is the subject of the decision being appealed; (b) the other party to the case in which the decision was rendered; (c) the relevant International Federation; (d) the *National Anti-Doping Organization* of the *Person's* country of residence or countries where the *Person* is a national or license holder; the International Olympic Committee or International Paralympic Committee, as applicable, where the decision may have an effect in relation to the Olympic Games, including decisions affecting eligibility for the Olympic Games or Paralympic Games; and (e) *WADA*.

# Roles and Responsibilities of WADA

---

20.7.8 To conduct doping controls as authorized by other Anti-Doping Organizations and to cooperate with relevant national and international organizations and agencies ~~and other Anti-Doping Organizations~~, including but not limited to, facilitating inquiries and investigations.

# UNESCO Compliance

---

23.4.1 Compliance with the *Code* shall be monitored by *WADA* or as otherwise agreed by *WADA*. Compliance with the commitments reflected in the *UNESCO Convention* will be monitored as determined ~~in consultation between~~by the Conference of Parties to the *UNESCO Convention*, ~~WADA and the applicable governments~~following consultation with the state parties and WADA. *WADA* shall advise governments on the implementation of the *Code* by the *Signatories* and shall advise *Signatories* on the ratification, acceptance, approval or accession to the *UNESCO Convention* by governments.

# Code Trumps Inconsistent ADO Rules

---

**24.6** ~~In case of a conflict between the Code and International Standards and the rules adopted by an Anti-Doping Organization that has accepted the Code, the Code prevails.~~**24.7**—The Purpose, Scope and Organization of the World Anti-Doping Program and the Code and APPENDIX I DEFINITIONS shall be considered integral parts of the Code.

# Failure of a Government to adhere to the UNESCO Convention

---

**20.3.10** After 1 January 2010, to ~~accept bids for~~ do everything possible to award World Championships only ~~from~~ to countries where the government has ratified, accepted, approved or acceded to the *UNESCO Convention* and the *National Olympic Committee*, *National Paralympic Committee* and *National Anti-Doping Organization* are in compliance with the *Code*.

**20.6.6** After 1 January 2010, to ~~accept bids for Events~~ do everything possible to award Events ~~from~~ to countries where the government has ratified, accepted, approved or acceded to the *UNESCO Convention* and the *National Olympic Committee*, *National Paralympic Committee* and *National Anti-Doping Organization* are in compliance with the *Code*.

## Failure of a Government to adhere to the UNESCO Convention.. continued....

**22.5** Failure by a government to ratify, accept, approve or accede to the *UNESCO Convention* by 1 January 2010 or to comply with the *UNESCC Convention* thereafter ~~will~~may result in ineligibility to bid for *Events* as provided in Articles 20.1.8 (International Olympic Committee), 20.3.10 (International Federation), and 20.6.6 (*Major Event Organizations*) and may result in additional consequences, for example: forfeiture of offices and positions within *WADA*; ineligibility or non-admission of any candidature to hold any *International Event* in a country, cancellation of *International Events*; symbolic consequences and other consequences pursuant to the Olympic Charter.

## WADA Statutes

### Article 6 (Foundation Board)

The second paragraph to Article 6 shall be amended as follows:

“Government representatives from a country which has not paid its due, or whose country has not adhered, prior to January 1 2009, to the UNESCO International Convention on Doping in Sport, will not be eligible to sit on the Foundation Board or the Executive Committee. On 1<sup>st</sup> January of each year, any Foundation Board or Executive Committee member representing a country which has not paid its due for the previous year will automatically lose its seat as a Foundation Board or Executive Committee member. The same rule shall also apply to membership of ad hoc or standing committees, however, for specific expertise requirement, the chair of the committee, in agreement with the Director General and the Chairman of the Foundation Board, can still grant membership to an independent expert from a country which has not paid its due.”

# Registered Testing Pool

---

## Registered Testing Pool in Team Sports

The *International Standard for Testing* will make clear that Team Sports may select membership on certain teams or levels of teams as a basis for establishing a *Registered Testing Pool*.
